client who is ready to pay her once the vegetables are ripe. Jane is keen to ensure that she gets a

bumper harvest not only to maximize her profit but as a way of impressing her client and possibly

getting more clients. She is looking for quality fertilizer for her vegetables and stumbles upon a

shop in which several fertilizers are sold. She inquires and the owner of the shop - Farai

recommends "Top-Notch fertilizer", he explains that it is an excellent fertilizer which will give

her the results she wants. Jane is hesitant as she has never used this fertilizer before, but Farai

assures her that top notch fertilizer is exceptional. On the strength of that assurance, Jane

purchases 2 bags of the fertilizer. The receipt from Farai has the following terms:

"The sellers give no warranty as to the suitability of their product for any purpose

whatsoever and do not accept responsibility for any loss, damage or other consequences

arising form the use of the said product".

Jane proceeds to follow the instructions provided with the Top-Notch Fertilizer and applies the

fertilizer the same day but the bags are not enough to cover all the vegetables. Early the next

day, Jane discovers that all the vegetables on which she applied the fertilizer had dried up. Only

the portion of vegetables where she did not apply the fertilizer are unaffected. Jane is devasted

at the loss. She estimates the value of the destroyed vegetables at US\$12 000.

a. What legal issues arise from the above case study?
